Altar Visual - The theme of our Lenten journey this year is "Which Path Will You Choose?" On the altar, there are two paths: one leading to the cross and one leading nowhere. On each Sunday during Lent, there will be objects on each path representing choices based on the scriptures of that day.

The second Sunday of Lent reveals a shield and a woven cloth on the path to the cross. The shield is a reminder of God's promise to Abram to protect him and his people. **Genesis 15: 1,** "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield, your very great reward." The cloth of woven fabric represents the pattern of our spiritual ancestry. **Philippians 3: 17,** "Join with others in following my example and take note of those who live according to the pattern we gave you." On the other path is a spear, which represents conflict and aggression. The blue drape on the cross symbolizes loyalty.
