Altar Visuals: As we enter the Advent season and contemplate the arrival of the baby Jesus, our altar visuals will center on the theme of angels. Angels, intermediaries between God and humans, are mentioned numerous times throughout the Bible. While popular culture often portrays angels with wings, halos, and as female figures, biblical accounts describe them differently—as shining, glorious messengers, frequently appearing as male. Each Sunday, the altar will highlight a different character visited by the Angel Gabriel and the significance of his message. In these encounters, Gabriel's words often begin with, "Be not afraid," offering comfort and hope as God's promises unfold. May these visuals invite us to reflect on God's messengers and the profound messages they bring during this sacred time.

Today we remember that an angel visited Joseph to let him know that it was right to marry Mary. This angel is not named but referred to as an "angel of the Lord". Again, the angel says, "Do not be afraid." Can you imagine what the world would have been like if Joseph had not gone against tradition and married Mary? On the curtain there are 3 more symbols, the lamp – Jesus, Light of the World, the fish – an early symbol of Christianity, the sign of JOY – to remember Mary's joy, "my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" Luke 1:43. Shepherds have been added to the manger as they now await Mary and Joseph.
